History of the Memorial Service

The Nisei Soldiers Memorial Service (formerly called the Joint Memorial Service) began in 2006 at Punchbowl Cemetery as a way for the Nisei veterans who served in the 100th Infantry Battalion, 442nd Regimental Combat Team, Military Intelligence Service, and 1399 Engineer Construction Battalion, to pay tribute to their fallen comrades.


As the veterans became fewer in number through the years, their descendants wanted to continue the tradition and now host the event to honor all Americans of Japanese ancestry (AJA) soldiers who served in WWII. The service is held on the Sunday in September that is closest to the date that the first AJA soldier was killed in combat – Sgt. Joe Takata of the 100th Infantry Battalion who died on September 29, 1943, near Salerno, Italy.

Brendan Po'ohala Burns is the grandson of the late Governor John A. Burns, who was governor of Hawai'i from 1962 to 1974. He is the principal of Aina Haina Elementary School; in April, 2017, he was recognized as a finalist for the Masayuki Tokioka Excellence in School Leadership Award. He is also the author of *An Aura of Greatness: A Reflection on Governor John A. Burns*, a leadership, legacy, and historical book about his

grandfather. Mr. Burns has given speeches about his book across Hawai'i. After WWII, Governor Burns was named an honorary member of the 442nd RCT because of his support of people of Japanese ancestry in Hawai'i.
